CRC Capacity building

- **Training of CRC staff and volunteers** (working in reception centres for asylum seekers)
- **Training of PSS team** (emergency situations and crisis team)
- **Information session for RFL** (for RFL staff working in RC branches)
- **Upcoming plans:**
- Conducting a **training for a transit PSS camp staff and volunteers** (RFL, Interpreters and THB vulnerability assessment)

Activities in asylum reception centres

- PSS and social services
- Focus on empowerment of refugees and migrants vulnerable to exploitation: information, access to education and skills building, self-esteem (while seeking employment)
- Continuing care and follow up

- Trafficking prevention activities in the reception centres: information on TiP provided in appropriate way - individual talks, workshops, movies followed by discussion

Transit camp Slavonski Brod



- Winter reception/transit camp opened on 3 Nov 2015
- Possibility to accommodate up to 5,000 persons (capacities being increased with time)
- Daily fluctuation of migrant approx. 5,000 persons
- Average length of stay: 2-12 hours

Activities in transit camp

- **Identification of vulnerable groups** (first rapid needs assessment of vulnerable groups and immediate response (USC))
- **Outreach**
- **Network for social services** (referral to social services and UNHCR)
- **PSS**
- **RFL** (leaflets and posters on family unification/avoidance of separation in key languages)
- **Protection** (UAMs, safe accommodation)
- **Meeting humanitarian needs**

Unaccompanied minors

- **Identification:**
cooperation and referral in accordance with the National Referral Mechanism
- **Support to UAMs**
tailored to their needs and resources, and RC efforts to reducing their vulnerability to THB



Challenges in AT response

- How to identify potential/actual victims
What identifying indicators to use in the transit camp (too many children and too little age difference between them, single father with babies and small children, UAMs, single pregnant women...)
- What information to give to meet the objective
Migrants without documents, paying for smugglers, how to approach the situation with a unified / common message for refugees
- How to get disclosure without people feeling forced
